About Our Program

Sign In & Out Procedures

The Afterschool Program will begin at school dismissal. School personnel will send the Afterschool Participants to the designated area where Afterschool staff will check-in the children. Safety is a top priority of the Tri-County YMCA, therefore identification may be requested at any time during pick up for the child(ren). Each child must have their own registration on file.

Payment Policy

Payments are taken out the Saturday after the week your child(ren) attends the Afterschool Program. If payment is returned, an attempt will be made to run the payment again. If payment is not received within 14 days, an invoice will be sent to the parent/guardian. If payment is not paid beyond 14 days this will result in suspension of the program. A child(ren) can be reinstated after the payment is received and approved by the Afterschool Coordinator.

Late Pick Up

The Afterschool Program ends promptly at 6:00 p.m. EST. There is a charge of \$1.00 per minute per child remaining past 6:00 p.m. If an emergency should arise, please contact your child's Afterschool Site.

Closings & Early Release Policy

If school is closed, the Afterschool Program will not operate. If school should dismiss early, The Afterschool Program will not operate. During **scheduled** school breaks, the Tri-County YMCA will offer Holiday Camp at our Ferdinand YMCA facility. Information will be sent via email, posted at our Afterschool locations, and social media regarding details with our Holiday Camp program.

Illness Policy

For the protection of all children, your child should be kept at home if he/she shows any signs of the following symptoms:

- An elevated temperature of 100.5 degrees or above (without medication)
- Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Contagious disease or infection including an undiagnosed rash, discharging eyes or ears

Parents will be contacted to pick up a sick child if any of these symptoms appear in our care.

A child MUST be symptom free for 24 hours before returning

Medical Emergencies

In the event of a medical emergency or accident, staff will work quickly to assess the situation and make the appropriate calls. If the child is seriously injured, 911 will be called first and staff will then attempt to contact the parent of the child. If a parent can not be contacted, the emergency contact will be called. If it is impossible to reach any of the contacts listed, transportation will be arranged to take the child to Memorial Hospital in Jasper, IN, where the Emergency Room Physician will care for the child.
